try guessing the word.

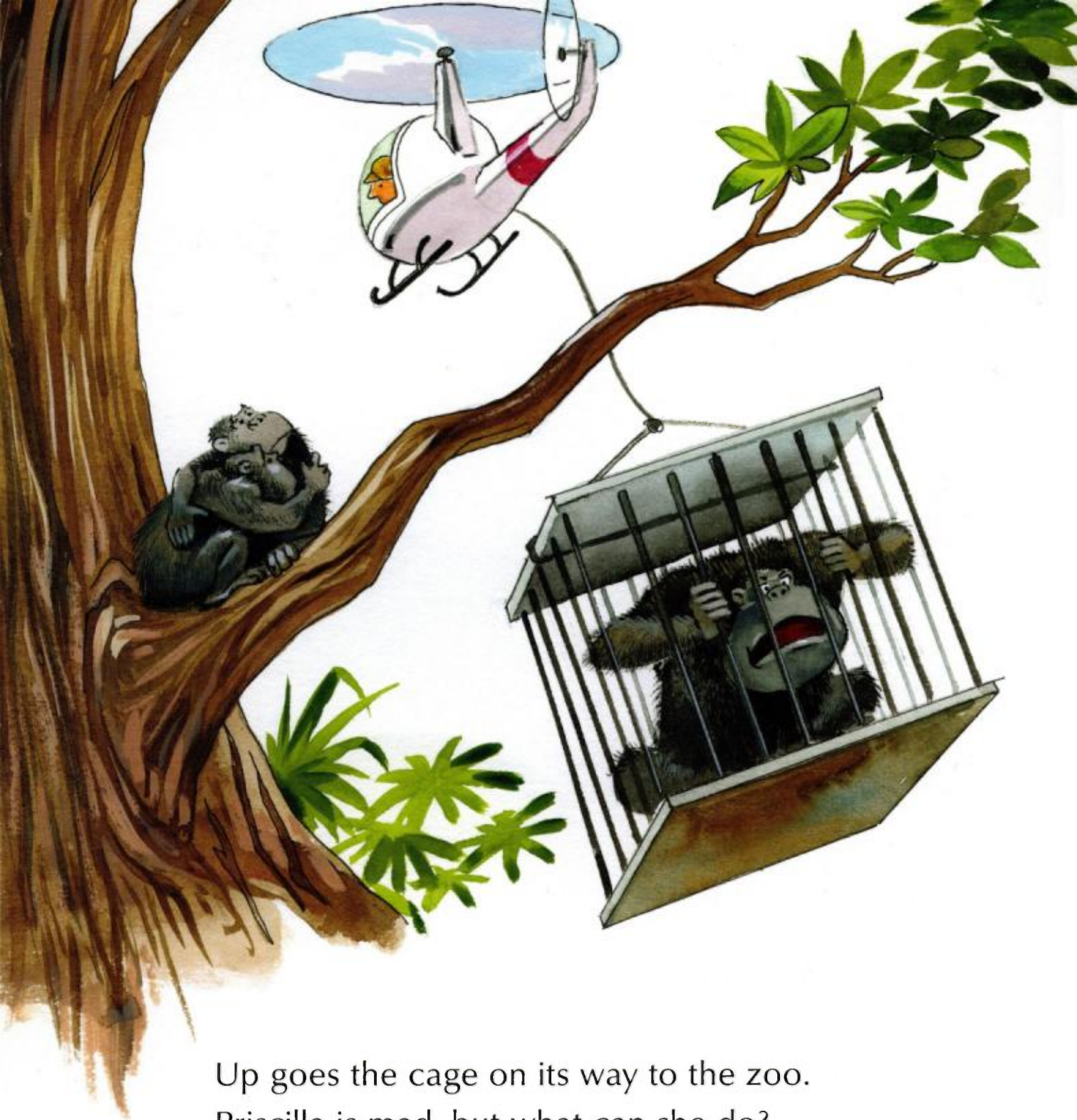
That is the time for YOU to be heard.



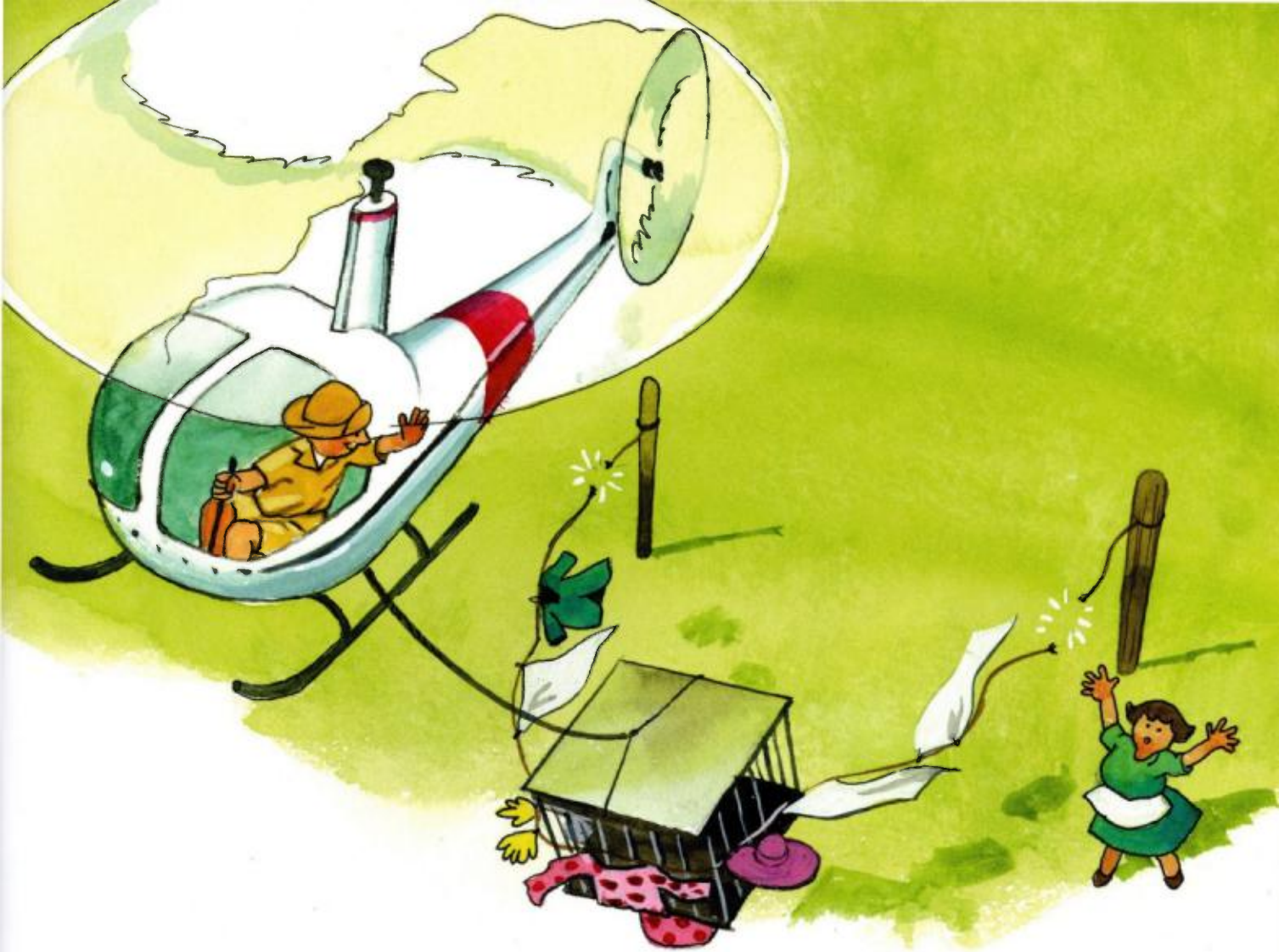
Deep in the jungle lives a mama gorilla.
